



Section 504 Grants:

- The lifetime total of the grant assistance to any recipient is \$7,500.
- The full amount of the grant must be repaid if the property is sold less than 3 years from the date the grant was approved.

SECTION 504 HOME REPAIR LOAN/GRANT PROGRAM

Section 504 Program Objective:

Section 504 loans and grants are intended to assist very low-income owner occupants of modest single family homes in rural areas repair their homes.

Loan Purposes:

Loan funds may be used to make general repairs and improvements to properties or to remove health and safety hazards, as long the dwelling remains modest in size and design.

Grant Purposes:

Grant funds may be used *only* to pay the costs for repairs and improvements that will remove identified health and safety hazards or to repair or remodel dwellings to make them accessible for household members with disabilities.

Eligibility Requirements:

Section 504 Loan

- Must have the legal capacity to incur the obligation.
- Applicants must demonstrate adequate repayment ability, as demonstrated by a budget completed by a Rural Development representative.
- Adjusted household income must not exceed the applicable very low-income limit for the area. Your local Rural Development Office can advise you of the income limits for your area.
- Applicants must be United States citizens or a non-citizen who qualifies as a legal alien.
- Applicants must agree to and have the ability to occupy the dwelling on a permanent
 basis.
- Applicant must be unable to secure the necessary credit from other sources on terms and conditions that the applicant could reasonably be expected to fulfill. Applicant must also lack the personal resources to meet their needs.
- Must have a credit history that indicates a reasonable ability and willingness to meet debt obligations.

Section 504 Grant

- Must meet eligibility requirements for Section 504 Loan, except #2 above.
- Applicant must be 62 years of age or older at the time of application.
- Must be unable to repay a Section 504 Loan (amortized over the maximum number of years).

Dwelling Requirements

- Dwelling must be considered modest for the area, must not be designed for income providing purposes, cannot include an in-ground swimming pool or have a value that exceeds the maximum loan limit for the area.
- Loans may be made only in rural areas designated by RHS. Your local Rural Development Office can advise you of the eligible areas in your county.

LOCAL LAW NO. FOF THE YEAR 2001 2 TOWN OF BERGEN, COUNTY OF GENESEE

A Local Law To Override The Tax Levy Limit Established In General Municipal Law §3-c For The Fiscal Year 2013

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the intent of this Local Law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Bergen, County of Genesee pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Bergen, County of Genesee to adopt a town budget for the fiscal year 2013 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 2. Authority.

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town Board to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override.

The Town Board of the Town of Bergen, County of Genesee is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2013 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of the Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined to its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation, or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
