To Whom It May Concern:

As you may know, in August 2012, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed legislation amending Section 27-a of the Labor Law which requires employers to provide certain emergency escape systems to firefighters at risk of entrapment at elevations. We at the New York State Department of Labor (the "Department") are charged with enforcing this provision of the Labor Law that requires employers to assess the risk of firefighter entrapment at elevations and provide equipment and training to address that particular risk.

To assist fire departments and municipalities in achieving compliance with this provision of the Labor Law, we provided the following materials at the link below. Please note that the risk assessment worksheet has been modified to assist you in determining whether you need emergency escape equipment:

- a training video on emergency escape systems;
- a copy of the amended law;
- a copy of the regulations;
- a revised risk assessment worksheet (enclosed);
- an equipment inspection guide; and
- a list of our Public Employee Safety and Health ("PESH") district offices.

This online resource will outline the specific steps each fire department must take to comply with the law. Of course, the Department will continue to work with fire departments throughout the state to ensure that they are in compliance with the legislation and will provide additional guidance where needed.

Dear Supervisor Cunningham,

On February 20, 2014, the New York State Department of Public Service issued an Order Requiring Risk Assessments and Remediation of New York Gas Facilities (issued and effective February 20, 2014) (Risk Assessment Order) in Case 11-G-0565, which required all New York State natural gas local distribution companies (LDCs) to conduct risk assessments of their natural gas distribution systems. Specifically, during the course of an investigation of a natural gas explosion in Horseheads, New York, investigators found evidence of excavation damage to distribution pipelines, possibly caused by subsequent municipal installation of services. The Commission's statewide gas risk assessment initiative is aimed at identifying and repairing pipelines the conditions of which are similar to those found during the Horseheads investigation.

Therefore, in the coming weeks and months, natural gas LDCs operating in your jurisdiction should be contacting you seeking information pertaining to the installation dates and locations of underground facilities such as water and sewer networks installed by your municipality or a sub-contractor hired by your municipality. I am writing to ask for your cooperation in quickly responding to the utility's requests for excavation and service installation records. The goal of this endeavor is to identify at-risk natural gas pipelines so that utilities can make the necessary repairs in order to maintain and improve the safety of natural gas distribution systems throughout New York State. Any information you are able to provide the LDCs will assist them in conducting these comprehensive risk assessments and will ensure the risk





assessments are complete. Perhaps most importantly, the information you provide may help the LDCs focus their efforts on areas in your jurisdiction most in need of rehabilitation.

I personally thank you for any assistance you provide. While we have no reason at this time to believe any imminent threat exists in your area, these assessments must be conducted promptly and thoroughly, so that any necessary repair can be made. If you have any questions about this process or the validity of any request(s) made to you by LDCs operating in your jurisdiction, I can be personally reached at 315-428-5154.

Application Form A --- Item #2 Scope of Work/ Work Plan



The overall purpose of this strategic plan is to identify and prioritize actions that will increase the economic viability of all types of agricultural and agri-business enterprises in Genesee County.

The new plan must address emerging agricultural issues in Genesee County including, but not limited to, accessing markets for existing products and developing new agricultural products and value-added agricultural products to supply untapped markets.

Tasks:

- 1. Assess the county's current agricultural economy:
 - "Data mining" to better understand current production, current markets, potential markets, and potential production to serve those markets.
 - Interviews with key farmers in various sectors.
 - Interviews with public and private agencies involved in the agricultural economy including, but not limited to, Cornell Cooperative Extension, United State Department of Agriculture, Genesee County Soil and Water Conservation District, Farm Credit, Farm Bureau, banks, agri-businesses, etc. and their boards.
 - Surveys of local elected boards, and planning boards.
 - Interviews with consumers, especially institutional users such as the community college, schools, nursing homes, etc.
 - Interviews with agricultural educators.

Deliverables: A concise overview of the county's current agricultural economy, including products and existing markets, opportunities for expanded production of current products, potential new products, and untapped markets; an analysis of barriers to markets; and an analysis of the agricultural economy's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT analysis).

- 2. Identify farmland proposed to be protected and developed land in Agricultural Districts:
 - Consultation with local land trusts to assess their priorities
 - Consultation with United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service to identify prime, unique, or important farmlands or soils.
 - Review of recent local comprehensive plans and agricultural and farmland preservation plans to identify local goals.
 - Use of County data to identify lands in Agricultural Districts, lands receiving Agricultural Assessments, other active farms, and developed land enrolled in Agricultural Districts.

Deliverables: Identification of prime, unique, and locally important soils and farmlands; NYS Agricultural Districts, lands receiving Agricultural Assessments, recommended lists of properties to be added to and removed from the Agricultural District program.

- 3. Analyze lands identified for potential protection:
 - Calibration and use of Natural Resource Conservation Services Land Evaluation and Site Assessment system (LESA) to prioritize farmlands proposed for protection.

Deliverables: Identification of agricultural lands in the county as they are prioritized for protection.

- 4. Identify and select goals and strategies to invigorate Genesee County's agricultural economy:
 - Meet with focus groups to review the results of Tasks 1, 2 and 3.
 - Meet with focus groups to identify attainable and measurable goals with accompanying objectives and implementation projects.
 - Work with project partners to identify potential implementation strategies and funding sources.

Deliverables: At least three (3) attainable and measurable goals with accompanying objectives and projects. Projects will include at least two (2) agriculturally-based economic development ventures ready for implementation for which implementation funding can immediately be sought. One of the ready-to-implement ventures should have the potential for broad impact throughout the county's agricultural sectors while other



ventures may be specific to certain sectors or commodities. Additionally an implementation matrix will show key projects, responsible agencies, cost estimates, potential funding sources, and an implementation time frame. The implementation strategy will include projects ready for immediate submission to the Finger Lakes Regional Economic Development Council for funding.

- 5. Model form-base code regulations for rural transect zones:
 - Research proposed and adopted form-based codes across the country for practices that best protect natural resources and farmland specifically.
 - Prepare model Rural Transect Zone language that promotes farmland preservation and discourages low-density development utilizing tools such as Transfer of Development Rights (TDR).

Deliverables: Model Rural Transect Zone language that can may be incorporated into a municipal form-based code (ie. SmartCode).

- 6. Identify other county or municipal planning and land use programs consistent or inconsistent with the agricultural and farmland protection plan:
 - Review and analyze municipal comprehensive plans, land use regulations, subdivision regulations, local economic development initiatives, etc. in those areas of the County facing the most conversion pressure.
 - Review and analyze the plans and policies of plan partners, including, but not limited to, the Genesee County Smart Growth Plan, the Genesee County Comprehensive Plan, the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy, the Genesee County Economic Development Center, and the Finger Lakes Regional Economic Development Council's Strategic Plan.

Deliverables: A matrix indicating the objectives of the selected plans and whether or not they are consistent with goals identified in this process and the overall mission of promoting agricultural land uses. A table showing the status of local regulations and the extent to which they are or are not protective of agricultural lands.

7. Farm Community and Citizen Participation:

In addition to widely publicized hearings as required for plan adoption, the Genesee County Planning Department, partnering agencies and consultants will make every effort to include participation from farmers and interested citizens. A Farmland Protection Plan Steering Committee will oversee and direct the production of the plan including the ranking the strategies proposed by the plan. In addition to the interviews and focus groups described in the work tasks above, each agency will include progress reports and opportunities to participate in their existing communications with board members and clients. Farmers markets throughout the county could be a conduit to disseminate and collect information from both producers and consumers/citizens. A web page would be developed as part of the Planning Department's existing web page to provide progress reports and opportunities for input.

8. Final Plan Document:

Prepare and deliver a strategic and focused Genesee County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Plan that meets the requirements of NYS Department of Agriculture & Markets Municipal Agricultural and Farmland Protection Planning Program requirements and addresses all 7 tasks described above.

Deliverables: A Final document in a searchable, web-optimized PDF and hard copy format including an executive summary and a prioritized implementation matrix. Any GIS data created or modified as a result of the project.

- 9. The Genesee County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board will submit the proposed plan to the Genesee County Legislature for their review and approval. The Genesee County Legislature will approve the plan by resolution.
- 10. Once a resolution approving the plan is adopted, the Genesee County Legislature shall submit the plan to the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets for approval.
