# COMMEMORATING the 200th Anniversary of the Town of Amherst, New York

WHEREAS, The Town of Amherst will proudly mark its 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a series of celebrations throughout its Bicentennial Year, beginning on January 1, 2018 with a 200th Birthday Party, and continuing with a gigantic Parade, historic walking tours, slogan contest, Interclub Service Club Luncheon and gala Bicentennial Ball; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of the Town of Amherst's rich history and enduring contributions, it is indeed an honor to pay tribute to this Town upon the occasion of its Bicentennial; now, therefore, be it

# TOWN OF BERGEN SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

## Policy purpose:

This Social Media Policy (the "Policy") provides guidelines for the establishment and use by the Town of Bergen ("Town") of social media as a means of conveying information to members of the public. The Town of Bergen has an overriding interest in protecting the information posted on its social media sites and the content attributed to the Town, including its elected and nonelected officials and personnel.

The intended purpose of the Policy is to:

- A. Disseminate information from the Town about the Town's mission, meetings, activities, and current issues to members of the public via various Internet channels.
- B. Make public information more readily available, thereby encouraging greater public understanding of, and participation in the Town's governance.
- C. Provide access to forms of electronic communication and e-commerce functions to enhance the traditional walk-in experience to our Town's departments.
  - D. Inform residents and visitors about government services and local attractions.
  - E. Use emerging technology to enhance Town services.
  - F. To further enhance the Town of Bergen's messaging and news delivery systems.

### **Definition of Social Media**

Social Media includes internet and mobile-based tools for sharing information. This information may take the form of:

- A) Facebook
- B) Twitter
- C) Podcasts
- D) Forums
- E) Message boards
- F) Photos
- G) Videos
- H) Real-time communications (Video chat)



### Content policy:

The Town of Bergen social media channels will serve to outsource news of the Town of Bergen only. Any comments and/or questions or additional information on content posted to social media sites shall be directed to the Town Clerk.

# General policy:

This policy shall apply to all Town departments, agencies as well as affiliated and non-affiliated governmental or non-governmental boards, organizations, or groups.

The establishment of **any** Town of Bergen social media site is subject to **prior** approval by the Town of Bergen Town Board

The Town Clerk or another person designated by the Town Board shall maintain and update content and information to be posted on social media sites.

The Town of Bergen shall use social media sites as consistently as possible and in conjunction with other established Town of Bergen communication tools

The Town of Bergen reserves the right to terminate any Town of Bergen social media site at any time without notice.

Town of Bergen social media sites shall comply with use rules and regulations required by the site provider, including privacy policies as well any applicable federal, state, and county laws, rules, regulations and policies.

All persons representing the Town of Bergen on Town of Bergen social media sites shall conduct themselves at all times as professional representatives of the Town of Bergen and in a manner consistent with all Town of Bergen policies.

All Town of Bergen social media sites shall use authorized Town of Bergen contact information for account setup, monitoring and access.

Town of Bergen social media sites may contain content including, but not limited to, advertisements or hyperlinks over which the Town of Bergen has no control. The Town of Bergen does not endorse any hyperlink or advertisement placed on Town of Bergen social media sites by the social media site's owners, vendors, or partners.

The Town of Bergen reserves the right to change, modify, or amend all or part of this policy at any time.

# Content guidelines:

- A. Postings must contain information that is freely available to the public and not be confidential as defined by any Town of Bergen policy state or federal law.
- B. Postings may not contain any personal information, except for the names of employees whose job duties include being available for contact by the public.
- C. All postings shall be subject to review and approval by the Town. This includes, but is not limited to, information, articles, pictures, videos or any other form of communication that is posted on a Town of Bergen social media site.
- D. Social Media content shall be factual and accurate.



- E. Use of Social Media shall be consistent with transparency and openness.
- F. Erroneous or inaccurate material shall be corrected as soon as possible.
- G. Content shall be tailored to protect citizen privacy.
- H. Content shall not act to endorse or advertise any business.
- I. Content shall be topically relevant to the Town.
- J. Content may not be used to solicit or promote any religious, political or personal causes.

Except as expressly provided in this policy, accessing any social media site shall comply with all applicable Town of Bergen policies pertaining to communications and the use of the internet by employees, including email content.
