Hello,

The Genesee County Water System Hookup Administrative Review Committee has received an application for a water hookup for a Residential Home at 7050 Townline Rd in the Town of Bergen. Please find a scanned copy of the application attached.

As required by the Genesee County Smart Growth Plan, the Administrative Review Committee must request a recommendation from the municipality in which the proposed hook-up is located. Municipalities will have **five** business days to respond in writing with their recommendation to the review committee.

At this time, the Committee is soliciting a recommendation from the Town on the aforementioned application. The Committee reviews applications based on the following seven criteria. The Town may use these criteria (those that apply) to form a recommendation to the Committee:

- 1. Impacts on the viability of Agriculture. "including the proximity of the hook-up to farms and surrounding farmland, the property's enrollment status in the Agricultural Districts program, the enrollment status of property immediately surrounding it, the existence of drainage infrastructure, the farming history of the property, and the presence of prime farmland soils on a property yet to be built upon."
- 2. Consistency with County economic development goals.
- 3. Consistency with other available infrastructure.
- 4. Consistency with local comprehensive plans, zoning, and other land use controls and development objectives.
- 5. Impact on Village/ City revitalization programs.
- 6. Whether it is meeting a public health or community need.

7. Impact on land identified as an Ecological Network or Natural Asset Core by the Green Genesee Smart Genesee Project.



Town of Bergen Supervisor,

I just finished reading the Town of Bergen News Notes. I see that the water district construction has been approved and construction on this project will begin next year. I am vehemently opposed to having to pay for water which I already have on my property on Warboys Road. I have an abundant supply of good fresh water provided by my well system. I do not want "city" water that is contaminated with poisonous chlorine. I am told that I need to pay this \$500 + tax whether I connect to water or not. We moved here and live "in the country" to avoid having to pay for things like public water and sewer tax. Our taxes are already exorbitant at almost \$7000 per year for town, county and school taxes. Other that plowing our road and stoning and taring our road every 10 years or so, what services do we receive for the taxes we pay? I have friends that live in affluent areas; Pittsford and Brighton, who pay less total taxes on their homes that we do in Bergen. I realize that New York State is the "Tax Capital" of the United States, but rural property taxes on homes and property that is already owned and paid for is totally out of control. What ever happened to the 2% cap per year on property taxes?

Our property taxes go up 5 to 10% every year. Again, I am vehemently opposed to having to pay this additional tax.
