Town News ... From the Desk of Town Supervisor Ernest Haywood

Many of you are noticing water pipe arriving along roadsides throughout the Town. Construction on our water district is finally underway! We held a pre-construction meeting on February 22 and we closed on a \$5,850,000 Bond Anticipation Note to fund the construction on February 23.

We have begun to work on a schedule of sign-up sessions for residents to meet with the Monroe County Water Authority and Town Engineers; you will receive a letter with the date of your session. There will be five sessions beginning in March and ending in June. Every resident in the district will be assigned to a session based on the contractors' proposed schedules and the Water Authority's recommendation. We ask that you make the date assigned to you a priority, but if you cannot make it to that session, we will make arrangements for you to attend an alternative session or complete the process by phone/and or mail. The first session March 22, 2022 will include residents of Pocock, Swamp, Warboys, Sautell, Dublin and Jerico Roads. April 12, 2022 will be residents of North Bergen, Reed and West Sweden Roads will be in Session 2. The third session May 3, 2022 will be Cook, Creamen and West Bergen Road residents. Session 4 May 24, 2022 will be Sacket, Old State, School, Gilbert, Lyman, Connelly Roads and Maple Avenue. The fifth session June 14, 2022 will be Evans, N. Lake, Peachey, Buffalo and Clinton Street Roads. All sessions will be 3:00 – 7:00 pm.

The Monroe County Water Authority will mail every property owner in the district a packet of information as the date for your sign-up session approaches. Please read it carefully. You will have to complete the Water Authority's forms and make a payment to them.

At the sign-up session you will be able to confirm with the engineer your desired location for the water service and receive a stake you will place in your yard. The Water Authority will attend remotely and answer any questions you may have about their sign-up process. Remember, you must hire an installer to run the water line from the road into your house and connect to your fixtures (the connection must be done to the Water Authority standards).

In other business not related to water, the Town Board opted out of cannabis legislation that would have permitted cannabis dispensary and on-site consumption parlors to be located in the Town. The Town can opt-in in the future, however the way the state legislation was written, municipalities that did not opt out prior to December 31, 2021 could never opt out. We joined with many other municipalities that chose to opt out, at least for now, until the State puts into place the regulations regarding the operation of these businesses. If the Board decides in the future to opt-in, a public hearing must be held so that you have a voice in the decision.

Finally, I would like to welcome our newest Town Board Member Teresa Whalin. Many of you know her well already. Teresa is serving on the Parks, Policies and Personnel committees.

Thank you to our highway crew for the great job they have been doing this snow season. We appreciate it!

From the Desk of County Legislator Christian Yunker

As Spring approaches and we progress and hopefully reemerge from under the cloud of the pandemic, we are optimistic of the direction we are headed as a County. Despite the optimism, every consumer and business are feeling the effects of inflation and a new level of costs. Government is no different, we have seen the escalation of costs of just about everything required to run a municipal government. Our 184 bed County Jail project is well underway with our bond resolution passed and initial construction bids are live. There remains concerns of rising construction material costs as well as the availability of many of the specialty components. The timeline is still progressing with breaking ground sometime this Spring.

Progress continues with phase 2 of the water infrastructure project. We continue to scour all the possible sources of outside funding for these projects. We recently met with Congressman Jacobs to discuss any possible federal funds as well as using all our contacts and resources at the State level. The County is wrapping up several mainline and pump projects in Monroe and eastern Genesee County. The basis of design work continues on phase 3 as water availability and quantity continues to be a big focus of the County over the coming years.

Another focus of the County is looking into how to improve and potentially get every resident Broadband access. The Genesee Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council have been tremendous partners in this review and continue to provide guidance and direction. We recently reviewed a map of the entire county and all the potential "holes" in coverage. We have dollars set aside to assist with this, but need to leverage it with State and Federal broadband program monies to tackle this issue effectively. We will be looking for input from all our municipal partners as well as the providers. This issue is certainly a focus of County leadership. Stay tuned.

The County has also recently taken a much more involved role in our EMS and fire service. As demands on these services has increased, the workforce and volunteer numbers have declined. If we are not in it already, we are entering in a time of crisis in this area. County leadership is ready to deploy resources towards this effort as we learn more of the needs and how to do so most effectively.

Internally, our mental health department continues to have more demands from the Community and our workforce needs have increased with this demand, much of this due to the pandemic and changing demographics. IT infrastructure is another area of need as we try to be on the frontline of protection for our systems as cybersecurity threats are ever increasing. Both these departments we are making a larger than normal investment in. Covid test kits are available for free if needed anytime for whomever is in need. Enjoy Spring and the warmer weather! As always, feel free to contact us anytime with any questions or concerns you many have.
