NEWS FROM THE DESK OF TOWN SUPERVISOR Ervic Haywood

We have begun working on the 2024 Bergen Town Budget. There are several challenges, most significant of which is the once again cut in sales tax shared by Genesee County. I have discussed this issue in past newsletter articles, but it really strikes home as we begin work on yet another budget, with yet another cut in sales tax.

The Town of Bergen received \$710,416 of sales tax in 2019. In 2024, the county share \$464,817 with the Town. The 35% reduction is actually equivalent to what Bergen budgeted to repair and maintain our town roads this year. It is a significant share of the Town of Bergen budget (sales tax covered 34% of the Town's annual budget back in 2019).

One unknown in the budget is whether voters will support the library district proposition on the ballot November 7. If the library proposition fails, funding of the library will remain in the Town of Bergen and likely be carried at the current level. If the library proposition passes, the Town of Bergen would remove that amount from our budget and whatever library budget is approved by voters would become a new separate tax levy on the town and county tax bill.

The Town of Bergen is delaying our budget public hearing on the 2024 budget until November 14 so that we will know the results of the library district vote before adoption. We are still not clear whether the creation of the district would take place immediately and thus impact the 2024 budget, or if there would be a one-year delay and the first library district tax not levied until the 2025 town and county budget.

Our grant application to the New York State's Consolidated Fund Application and Environmental Protection Agency was submitted in July. We are seeking funds for the installation of a restroom at the front of the park.

We are completing paperwork to close out the Water District project with Rural Development. We will be required to have another federal single audit for 2023 at the end of the fiscal year. The funds to pay for that audit will come from the project. I am pleased to share that the project was completed within budget.

Be sure to vote in November and enjoy our always lovely autumn!

From the Desk of County Legislator Christian Yunker

Progress continues on many of the Counties' major projects. The Jail we are constructing is progressing very well. Most of the work remaining is interior. The project continues to be on time with a scheduled completion date of January 2024. Despite a few change orders, the project remains well within our budget. To date this has been a very well run and successful construction project.



We are looking to wrap up phase 2 of the water infrastructure project this Summer that included many pump station improvements and water line upsizing. There has been an incredible amount of time and effort that has been put into efforts to obtain outside dollars from elected officials in the State and Federal level to put towards phase 3 our water project. We recently secured \$2 million dollars from Senator Gillibrand's office this Summer. Every dollar obtained from outside sources is dollars we don't need to obtain from our local taxpayers and water users. The most recent estimates show that phase 3 total costs will exceed \$150 million that includes closing of the 100-year-old Batavia City water plant.

We continue to work on contract with Mercy Flight to support their ambulance service throughout the County. EMS service is under incredible pressure throughout Upstate NY for coverage as these service providers continue to struggle with costs and labor supply. We are fortunate to have this provider in our County and look to strengthen and support them with a contractual relationship with deliverables for Ambulance coverage throughout the County. This should be in place sometime this Fall.

Work has begun on 2024 budgets. Like all municipalities, costs continue to rise. We have 2 of our largest unions negotiations this Fall. We will continue to run the County with fiscal responsibility while striving to provide exceptional service.

Genesee County is very excited to be in the direct path of totality for the 2024 Solar eclipse. There is advanced planning for this once in a lifetime event on April 8, 2024. There is planning for our community to see potentially tens to hundreds of thousands of additional people that day in our County. See http://geneseetheeclipse.com/. HUNTING LICENSES ARE ON SALE



A portion of all sales of NYS Hunting and Fishing Licenses purchased in the Town of Bergen stays in the Town of Bergen, so purchase your licenses at the Town Clerk's office during regular business hours. If you purchased a lifetime license you can pick up your free DMP permits. DMP permits are available until October 1st 2/\$10 with the purchase of a 2023-2024 hunting license. Extra DMP's will be available starting Wednesday, November 1st on a first come first serve basis also 2/\$10 or free if first set was already purchased.

DOG LICENSES



ALL DOGS, four months of age or older need to be licensed along with proof of rabies vaccination and neutering or spaying, if applicable, must be presented at the time of licensing. Dog licenses are due yearly from the date of licensing, if your dog's license renewal is due or past due, please take care of it so we don't have to send you a reminder notice or eventually a court appearance ticket. Please take care of any overdue or unlicensed dogs as soon as possible. Renewals can always be mailed in as long as there is updated rabies information sent along with payment. If your dog has died or you no longer own it, please let me know so I can take it out of the system.


ANTI-RABIES CLINICS



Each dog, cat and ferret must be accompanied by someone who can control it. Vaccinations are free for Genesee County residents but a \$5.00 voluntary donation per animal is requested to offset clinic expenses. Non-county residents must pay a mandatory \$5.00 fee per animal immunized:
